## **Caesar Duval Naturalization**

This document is from March 27, 1811. This is the document petitioning for U. S. citizenship for Caesar. It gives information of his birth and when he came to the US. This is a good document in itself. It lists Caesar as Legar Duval. His signature is of one who can barely write and may not have spoken good English. He probably had the same thing happen to him as to thousands of other European immigrants. The American pronunciation of his name probably resulted in his name being "Americanized" to Caesar. I know that this is Caesar Duval because the signature matches his revolutionary pension application that is clearly labeled "Caesar."

This naturalization document was largely unknown to researchers of the Taylor line. It had been originally a Newberry County record, but it had been moved to the South Carolina State Archives in Columbia. I discovered it quite by accident. One day in a Knoxville, TN genealogy library, I ran across a book titled South Carolina County Records that were moved to the State Archives. This document was in the listing for Newberry. On a visit to the archives, I was able to view and "fondle" the original document, along with his revolutionary war pension application, and William Taylor's naturalization petition.
