To get to Dyersburg

Dyersburg is located in Northwest Tennessee, 80 miles north of Memphis. It is twenty miles from the Mississippi River. It is on the interstate spur (I-155) that connects I-40 at Jackson, TN with I-55 at Caruthersville, MO. The map at the right is old and shows part of this route as state highway 20. The nearest major airport is at Memphis. A couple of local attractions might be of interest. Reelfoot Lake north of Dyersburg is a beautiful cypress swamp and lake that was formed by earthquakes in 1816 -1817. It is a wildlife preserve and management area. If you feel lucky, a 30 minute drive across the river to Caruthersville, MO takes you to casino gambling.



Motels:

All of the major motels are clustered in the same location. They are near the intersection of I-155 and highway 78 north of town (see map on flyer). I will be staying at the Hampton Inn.
